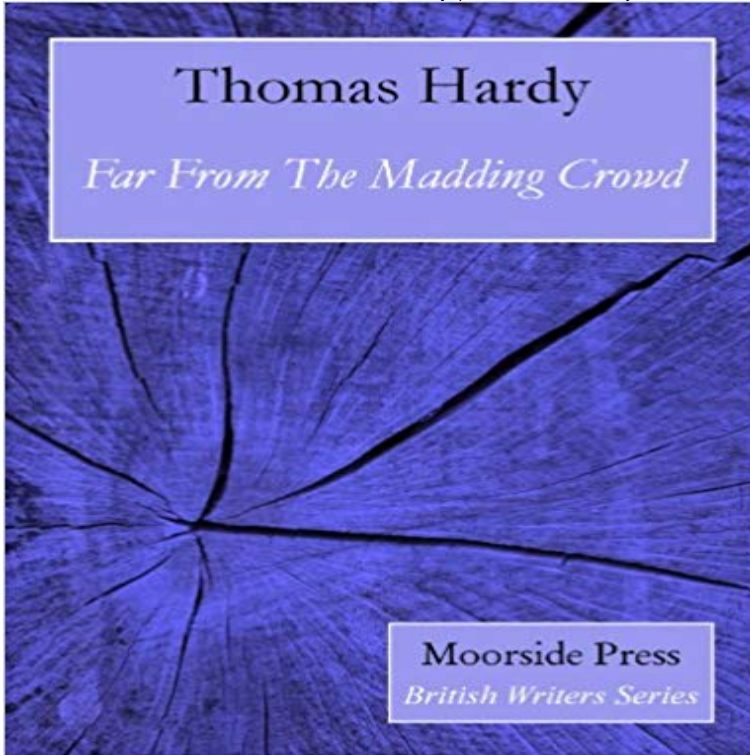


Far From The Madding Crowd (Annotated)

Published in 1874 as a serial story in the Cornhill Magazine, *Far From The Madding Crowd* was Hardy's fourth novel in as many years and the first of what critics consider to be his major works. The plot revolves around the female lead character, Bathsheba Everdene, her independent ways and how this impacts upon her choice of husband. The prospective candidates include examples of different economic backgrounds, with a farm labourer, Gabriel Oak, a prosperous farm owner, William Boldwood and a young dashing soldier, Frank Troy.
